

Unichem- Recall of cyclobenzaprine tablets

- On August 27, 2025, Unichem announced a voluntary, consumer level recall of one lot of cyclobenzaprine tablets because the cyclobenzaprine 10 mg label was inadvertently placed on a bottle containing meloxicam 7.5 mg tablets.
 - Clinical Services identified potentially impacted members and will send notifications to the members and their prescribers.
 - The member letter advises members to contact their prescribers or pharmacy for questions.
- The product was distributed nationwide.

- Cyclobenzaprine is a muscle relaxer and indicated as an adjunct to rest and physical therapy for relief of muscle spasm associated with acute, painful musculoskeletal conditions.
- Meloxicam is a non-steroidal anti-inflammatory drug, indicated for use in osteoarthritis, rheumatoid arthritis, and juvenile rheumatoid arthritis
- For patients who unknowingly take meloxicam there is a reasonable probability of serious adverse events including cardiovascular, gastrointestinal, renal, anaphylaxis, and skin reactions, particularly in those patients taking concomitant

non-steroidal anti-Inflammatory drugs and/or blood thinners, those who have allergies to the meloxicam, or those with underlying illness.

- To date, Unichem Pharmaceuticals has not received any reports of adverse events related to this recall.
- Anyone with the affected lots on hand should stop distribution and return product.
- Consumers should contact their physician or healthcare provider if they have experienced any problems that may be related to taking or using this drug product.
